

TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT NOTICE OF WOOLSBRIDGE ROAD, ASHLEY HEATH

DORSET COUNCIL has made a Notice under Section 14 [2] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 as amended. The Notice is needed in order to comply with health and safety regulations which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise the likelihood of danger to highway users. It will come into operation on 16th February 2024 between 09:00 and 16:00 and remain in force for five days, but it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 16th February 2024.

This Notice will enable Dorset Council to carry out carriageway maintenance and resurfacing works.

The effect of this Notice is as follows:

[i] To impose a temporary road closure on; Woolsbridge Road, Ashley Heath as indicated by signs on site.

[ii] To impose a clearway and parking suspension as indicated by signs on site to prevent waiting or parking on the highway along Woolsbridge Road, Ashley Heath.

During the closure periods there will be no on street parking available, and temporary parking restrictions will be implemented to prevent waiting or parking on the roads listed above. Please note that any vehicle waiting in contravention of temporary parking restrictions may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986. If a vehicle has been removed, the owner must contact the Council's vehicle recovery contractor: Ashleywood Recovery Ltd/Bride Valley Recovery Ltd on 01305 889421.

A locally signed diversion route will be put in place to enable traffic to travel around the closed section.
